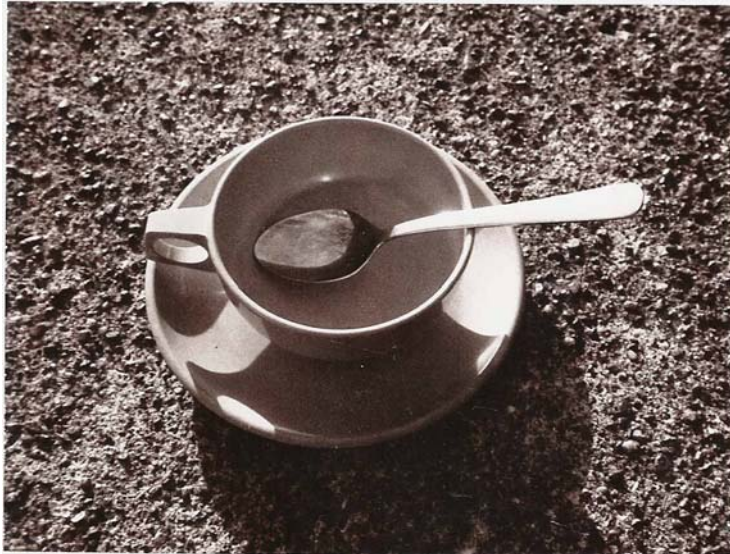


Announcing Twenty-third Annual Contest:

GRAND CHAMPION MOLDER OF WASHINGTON



Sponsored by Washington Chapter, AFS, contest is open to all. Ferrous and nonferrous entries will be accepted and judged in one category unlike in the past. Entrants may submit two castings—one ferrous and one nonferrous - if they so choose.

A one-piece casting is to be made from loose cup, saucer, and spoon (of molder's own choice), but the size of the parts should be standard table size, not tiny or very large. This is a change from past contests.

Although traditionally only green sand was used with no cores, for this contest any sand and binder system may be used, but exactly what molding techniques were used must be stated on the entry form and will be considered by the judges in determining award winners.

There will be a perpetual trophy and individual award plaques (number of awards up to three places to be determined by number of entries). \$100.00 will also be awarded to the overall winner.

There is no entry fee, and castings should be submitted to Bob Mortenson on or before Jan.29, 2010. Winners will be announced at Feb. AFS meeting.

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CONTEST RULES

1. This is an open contest; everyone is eligible to enter.
2. Casting is to be one piece made from a standard table size loose cup, saucer, and spoon of molder's own choice. (Spoon is to be placed in cup not on saucer.)
3. Although traditionally only green sand was used with no cores, for this contest any sand and binder system may be used, but exactly what molding techniques were used must be stated on the entry form and will be considered by the judges in determining award winners.
4. Sprue system is to be left intact; castings should be sandblasted clean, but otherwise there is to be no grinding or machining. (Castings submitted in previous years should not be resubmitted.)
